STITCHERY CENTRE AT IHILMIL COLONY

With the success of the Stitchery Centre at Sector-93 Noida and the response of so many underprivileged women benefitting from it, MKMES Secretary, Mr. Rishabh Gupta, initiated the launch of another Stitchery Centre at Jhilmil Colony.



This Stitchery Centre, located at D-230, Jhilmil Colony, Shahdra, Delhi-95, is taken care by Ms. Kanta Madaan, who has a working experience of 22 years with National Bal Bhavan as a Stitchery Expert. The Centre will cater to the needs of the underprivileged girls and women in the various slum clusters in the surrounding areas. Training is being provided free of cost for cutting, tailoring, embroidery and needle work to the poor women of all age-groups.



Mata Krishnawanti Memorial Educational Society has not just provided all the tailoring equipment like Singer machines, embroidery machines, etc. but also supplies the raw material like cloth, threads, etc. so as to facilitate a smooth & motivated environment for these women to learn. Such initiatives by the Society really prove to be beneficial as they help so many underprivileged women with the skills for income-generation and employment.

HEALING TOUCH

The Society endeavors to provide not just food, clothing and education to the underprivileged children but now there is a new dimension to it.
